## **Recovery Supports Update**

Peer Recovery Support Services (PRSS) has been busy this summer gearing up for the Recovery Coach Academies that were held on both sides of the state this fall in Alpena and Traverse City. Many people who take the Recovery Coach training are referred by other coaches who have also gone through the training themselves. In addition, we also do a lot of outreach by connecting with other organizations, attending recovery events, distributing literature, hosting workshops, giving presentations and trainings throughout the northern Michigan region and beyond. Throughout our networking these past few months, coaches and staff have had many opportunities to be a part of some amazing recovery events in the region. By attending these events we are able to offer hope and proof that recov-

ery works, as well as provide opportunities for those who want to help others. <u>Below are some of the events that Recovery Supports attended:</u>

\*Grand Traverse Band Health Fair—PRSS had a resource table where coaches talked recovery and shared recovery resources with those in attendance.

PRSS hosted a **Recovery Messaging Training** at the Gaylord University Center, facilitated by Deb Garrett from Detroit. 28 people from 16 different counties were in attendance. This training helped to shed stigma and elevate recovery in our communities, "Our Stories have power!"

\*Neighborhood Connections in Grayling High School—PRSS shared information and resources with students, parents and community members. Multiple Pathway Workshop in Traverse City at Horizon Bookstore—helped to educate others interested in starting and supporting Multiple Pathways of Recovery.


